What responsibilities does society have toward veterans after their service ends?

Learn About The Military in Your Community

- Find out if there are bases, reserve units, or National Guard facilities in your area and how they impact the local economy and community.
- Connect with local leaders and organizations to engage with community groups, schools, or local businesses that work with military families.
- Understand who represents you by identifying your elected officials and whether they serve on committees related to defense or veterans' affairs.
- Listen to military and veteran experiences. Reach out to service members or veterans in your community to better understand their perspectives and challenges.

Support The Military Community

- Attend local meetings or events and observe how local governments and organizations interact with nearby military installations and address related issues.
- Explore opportunities to support service members and veterans. Consider volunteering with organizations such as the USO or groups that serve military families and veterans
- Build connections across your community. Work with others to create partnerships that support military families, such as school programs or community initiatives.
